Susana Sanchez Roa, our head server at the Dante Club, has a 2-year-old nephew, Damian, who was recently diagnosed with hepatitis as a result of a cytomegalovirus infection.

Because of a previous misdiagnosis, Damian had to be taken to Mexico to be re-evaluated.

Damian is now fighting for his life and may need a liver transplant.

His parents never thought that their 2-year-old son would ever have to go through so much at such a young age.

For Damian to receive the medical care he needs, his family must travel to Mexico, Los Angeles and other places, which has become extremely expensive.

For Damian to be transported to a medical facility by helicopter, for instance, the cost is \$30,000.

Besides these high transportation costs, the family also must pay for various related expenses.

Susana said her family members and their friends hope to collect enough money through donations to help this little warrior through this hard time.

Anyone interested in helping Damian receive the care he needs and helping the family with their expenses can donate through their Go Fund Me campaign, which seeks to raise \$15,000.
