
On Monday, Aug. 19, we'll have our second summer barbecue instead of our regular membership meeting.

Dante Club's tour professional offers an accommodations special in Tuscany

Dante Club member Michael Micciche's Italy tour business, Italian Journeys of Sacramento, is offering exclusive non-hotel lodgings at the Rosa dei Venti properties in Tuscany to those who book a trip with him.

Travelers can stay in the luxurious Diamante apartment, within walking distance of the Tuscan town of Foiano Della Chiana and close to Cortona, Arezzo and other wine-area towns.

Micciche says he and his wife were the first occupants of the remodeled apartment and have stayed in it many times over nearly 20 years.

Diamante is a threebedroom, two-bathroom apartment outside the historic town center of Foiano della Chiana in Tuscany, 6 kilometers from Rosa dei Venti's farmhouse property in the countryside.

The kitchen is fully equipped with double

sinks, dishwasher, refrigerator, freezer, pots, pans and dishes.

From the apartment, visitors can walk to town and dine as the

locals do. Shops include butchers, delis, bakeries and shops selling fresh pasta, fruit and vegetables daily. The town has family restaurants, pizzerias and a weekly open-air market.

Diamante guests have access to the farmhouse activities at Rosa dei Venti, such as cooking classes and guided tours. The location is ideal for

visiting hill and walled towns in Tuscany and Umbria and is great as a base for touring other parts of Italy.

A train station nearby makes trips to Arezzo, Florence and Rome easy.

Guests must rent Diamante for a minimum of one week.

Savings are possible if they choose to stay longer, particularly for one month. Travelers can view photos and book through Italian Journeys. Email volareinitalia@gmail.com for details.

Micciche's booking services are free. He can escort, drive and interpret for travelers, as needed.

Those who prefer staying in a villa or a working farm can choose among apartments at Rosa dei Venti in the countryside.

Most units have two bedrooms, two bathrooms,

a living room and a fully equipped kitchen.

One apartment has three bedrooms and two bathrooms, and a cottage has one bedroom.

The Micheli family has owned the Rosa dei Venti properties since 1900. The Michelis can arrange wine tours, cooking classes and other activities.

The farm produces fruit, wine and olive oil, which can be purchased.

Sam was predeceased by his parents, Vincenzo and Vincenza Gallina; his wife, Katherine; and his sisters, Connie Gwinn and Jo Palermo.

Sam was beloved by his family, including his children, Helen (Mark) and Vincent; his grandchildren, Joseph, Mariah and Marshall; his many nieces and nephews; and, of course, his faithful Corgi, Dante. He also leaves behind family and friends in Madison.


