he Veneto region of Northern Italy offers a wealth of sights, including one of the most historically evocative cities: Asolo, known as "the Pearl" and "the City of a Hundred Horizons" because of its beautiful mountain setting.

The town includes the remains of an amphitheater and an aqueduct; Rocca, a castle dating from the late 12th to early 13th centuries; Caterina Cornaro, a castle that's now home to

2. A floor manager will oversee dinners to help ensure that our members have an exceptional experience.

3. The price for members dinners will be \$13 with a reservation and \$18 without. This is designed to encourage reservations, so the club manager can better estimate food purchases. Complimentary beer and wine with dinner will continue, as will half-price drinks for members. Typical pricing for comparable private-event dinners ranges from \$35 to \$40.

4. The Tuesday dinner price will decrease from \$28 to \$25.

5. The board will monitor the sound system, but speakers should speak into the microphone. Anyone in the back of the room who can't hear should stand up and say so.

6. An Italian flag will be displayed at member events.

7. Water will be on tables at all events.

8. Members will be asked about starting members dinners earlier, at 6:30 p.m.

9. Spumoni will be available for dessert.

10. Free hot dogs, beer and soft drinks will be served during the annual Easter egg hunt.

11. The annual Mother's Day brunch will continue to be held on Mother's Day.

12. The Viva Vino event will be held on a Saturday in late September or early October in an effort to improve attendance.

13. Member events will feature more Italian music.

14. Dante Club at the River Cats will be a day game this year on Sunday, April 17, so more families and children can attend.

15. At the July and August steak barbecues, cooks will fire up the grills earlier and include mushrooms and onions as accompaniments.

16. The golf committee will decide on the annual golf tournament location.

17. Attendance at the Sausage Stag Feed will be limited to members and guests age 21 and older.

18. Bocce will be available before members dinners.

19. The Christmas dinner price will be kept as low as possible, and large families will not be split up. 20. Bar service will be improved to ensure faster, better service.

21. The board will consider increasing member benefits. Members can now get reduced-cost dinners, half-price drinks and room rentals for events, free beer at members dinners and other free or reduced-cost social events.

22. Leftover food will be put in takehome containers and sold to members for a moderate price.

23. The new Dante Club manager will be responsible for developing and implementing a comprehensive marketing program to better publicize the Dante Club as a banquet facility and to improve the club's business performance.

24. The board will examine the costs and benefits of establishing a modestly priced Dante Club private label wine.

The Dante Club board of directors thanks all who took part in the social survey and offered suggestions. Social chairman Tom Novi and his committee hope the changes will help improve members' experience and better serve all members.

the Eleanor Duse Theatre; the Palazzo della Ragione, which houses the city museum; and a cathedral built in 1747 that houses the Assunta altar piece.

Asolo is known for its architecture and for its distinctive aristocratic atmosphere that can be felt in its many squares and cafés.

Another captivating town in the Veneto region is Bassano del Grappa, where Italians' favorite digestivo, grappa, was invented.



Visitors cross over the Brenta River in Bassano del Grappa via the Ponte degli Alpini, a historic wooden covered bridge. Architect Andrea Palladio designed it in 1569. A tavern on the bridge has remained unchanged since 1779.

Visitors can sample and purchase the popular brandylike beverage in various tasting rooms and retail shops. Bassano del Grappa is easy to walk around, as most of the town is free of cars. The beautiful Brenta River flows under the town's historic wooden covered bridge, Ponte degli Alpini, which offers good photo opportunities.

Architect Andrea Palladio designed the bridge in 1569 to replace one dating from at least 1209.

Palladio's bridge was destroyed in 1748 and rebuilt three years later.

The Nardini tavern on the bridge has remained unchanged since 1779.

In the heart of town, opposite the bridge in the old Palazzo delle Teste, is the Poli Grappa Museum,

In the heart of town, opposite the bridge in the old Palazzo delle Teste, is the Poli Grappa Museum, created by the Poli family in appreciation of grappa. Five self-guided instructional rooms help visitors appreciate grappa and include opportunities for tasting.

Other points of interest include a



cathedral built around 1000 and renovated in 1417. It contains artworks by Leandro da Bassano, Ottavio Marianali and others. The town museum features ancient archaeological remains, works by Antonio Canova and the Tiepolos, and drawings by Gian Lorenzo Bernini, Spagnoletto, Albrecht Dürer and Rembrandt. The Palazzo del Municipio, or Town Hall, erected from 1404, has a noteworthy loggia and a fresco attributed to Jacopo da Bassano.
