Italian Americans deserve broader recognition in U.S.

usually write about Italian travel, but this month I'd like to discuss my love of Italy and Italians from a different perspective.

We've heard much discussion recently about Columbus Day. Many of us think that rather than singling out one famous Italian in our country's history, it's time to ask public officials to acknowledge the Italian people as a whole for their many contributions to our American way of life.

We'd like to see October declared Italian Heritage Month and the second Monday of the month declared Italian Heritage Day.

In our quest for these designations, we would start with the city and county of Sacramento, then approach the state of California.

Perhaps, too, with the help of national Italian American organizations, we could establish October as Italian Heritage Month at the federal level.

To enhance our success, we will need to collaborate with Italian organizations in our area and also gain the support of non-Italian American groups and individuals. Our board of directors has asked Ron Pane and me to organize this effort, but we need as many members as possible to help advocate for support from friends, family and work colleagues.

As soon as possible, Ron and I will create a strategy and timeline and share these with the board and club members. We'll then need to seek volunteers.

We hope to form a strong partnership with the Italian Cultural Society, Piemonte Reale, Sons and Daughters of Italy and other groups willing to join the effort.

We will only ask for a resolution from the governing bodies, not an ordinance or statute.

If you're a member of other Italian clubs besides Dante, please start spreading the word. I think we should develop a petition and gather support and signatures soon. The support of individual elected officials will be crucial, and a sponsorship from a city councilmember or a county supervisor could help, too.

would fill books.


We will schedule a meeting to discuss roles and plans for moving forward.



The program collects only aluminum can tabs instead of entire cans because collection and storage of the tabs is easier and more hygienic.


Homeland news

The 2019 Giro d'Italia, a threeweek Grand Tour cycling race in Italy, will run from May 11 to June 2.

The event is the 102nd edition of the annual race and the first Grand Tour of the 2019 cycling season.

An individual time trial in Bologna will kick off the race May 11. The 2018 race winner, England's Chris Froome, will not defend his title this year.

Of the three major annual cycling tours — the Giro d'Italia, the Tour de France and the Vuelta Espania — the Giro d'Italia is considered the most grueling.
