Claiming our heritage

Little Italy in Sacramento keeps spirit of homeland alive

Italian roots run deep in Sacramento. Italians were among the earliest pioneers of Sacramento and have settled here since the Gold Rush. Generations of Italian Americans helped shape the cultural and economic landscape of Sacramento.

Between 1850 and 1870, Italians were concentrated along the city's Embarcadero. By the early 20th century, they were concentrated in the Southside, Oak Park, Land Park, midtown and east Sacramento neighborhoods.

In the 1930s and '40s, members of almost half of the households in Oak Park had come from Italy. Many lived along 39th Street, then called Carmello Boulevard.

After World War II, the largest concentration emerged in east Sacramento.

After a major fundraising campaign by the Italian community, construction of a new St. Mary's Church in 1948 at 58th and M streets attracted Italians to Sacramento from other city neighborhoods.

St. Mary's Church had served as a spiritual, social and ethnic hub for the Italian community since 1906, when it was founded at Eighth and N streets. The church moved to Seventh and T streets in 1916.

As an Italian parish church, St. Mary's was staffed by Italian priests, and masses were conducted in Italian.

By World War II, east Sacramento was home to many Italian truck farms and already populated by Italians.

Some of the stone farmhouses built by Italians still exist around East Portal Park in the heart of the neighborhood.

The five existing stone houses, known as the "Stone Sisters," were originally inhabited by Italian families with names such as Reali, Guidotti, Carli, Belluoimini and Brida.

In 1946, across the street from the park on Rodeo Way, 20 homes were built on Anthony Zito's produce farm. Italian families with names such as Defazio, Luigi, DaPrato, Pane, Puccinelli, Stefani, Grida, Guidotti, Procida and Reali lived in the homes.

The high concentration of Italian families gave the neighborhood a distinctly Italian flavor as the core of Sacramento's Italian community. Many Italian Americans still live in the area, and some still speak Italian. The Little Italy neighborhood, generally concentrated between 48th and 59th streets and bounded by J Street and Folsom Boulevard, grew and thrived through the 1950s, '60s and '70s and continues today.

Italians established many communal institutions in the neighborhood, in addition to St. Mary's Church. Giovanni Hall, a bocce club in East Portal Park, today has 65 league teams. Among schools are St. Mary's Elementary and St. Francis High schools, which generations of Italian American children have attended and that offer classes in Italian.

Italian American organizations operating in the area include the St. Mary's Italian Catholic Federation, Branch No. 45, established in 1936; the Dante Club, established in 1923; the Marsala Lodge, established in 1911; the East Portal Bocce Club, established in 1970; the Piemonte Reale, established in 1888; Arberesh of Sacramento, established in 1990; and the Italian Cultural Society, established in 1981.

The Italian presence in the Little Italy district continues with longtime residents and businesses. Many businesses, which grew up around the neighborhood to serve Italians, have operated along Folsom Boulevard and still dot the area.

Grocery stores with Italian goods have been a staple. They include the Corti family's Corti Bros. store at 59th Street and Folsom Boulevard; the Brida See HERITAGE, Page 6

family's Quality Market at 51st and Folsom; and the Velo family's Italian Importing Co. at 51st and Folsom.

Other businesses were the Stefani family's Square Deal Restaurant at 58th and Folsom, the Espanol Italian restaurant at 58th and Folsom, Relles Florist at 52nd and Folsom, Lagormarsino Seed at 51st and Folsom, Pietro Tallini Nursery at 56th and Folsom, Italian Law Office at 49th and Folsom, Pesce Locksmith at 53rd and Folsom, Nicoletti Funeral home at 54th and Folsom, Frank Lettini's Automotive at 52nd and Folsom, Bertolani Travel at 57th and J, Mario Duchini's Gas Station at 57th and H, Archie Bugatto Hardware at 56th and J, and Affinito's Italian Corners shopping complex at 51st and Folsom. A Bank of America branch was staffed by Italian branch managers operated at 53rd and Folsom, as did an Italian Vice Consulate office at 54th and Folsom. Many of these businesses still maintain the Italian heritage of the area.

The story of east Sacramento's Little Italy neighborhood should be claimed, told and kept alive to inspire the future of the Italian community.
