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Bocce league nears final championship games

esponding to the requests of many Dante Club members, the board approved expenses needed to install two bocce courts at the club. The courts had their grand opening in July last year and since then have continued to grow in popularity, sparking this year's creation of a bocce league.

Has it been well received? League participants report a strong *yes!* Forty-eight members and friends have been rolling since March, and in May they began a twice-monthly season. Eight teams playing once against each other for the first seven sessions and then in three-session playoffs will culminate in October in championship play.

"The heat got to us a few times over the summer but not enough to burn out our enthusiasm," said coorganizer Rich Battistessa.

2021 anniversary of Dante's death shrouded in controversy

Seven hundred years on, the question of where the remains of Italian poet Dante Alighieri should be kept remains divisive.

The dispute started after Italy's major daily, *La Repubblica*, published an article hinting at negotiations between the cities of Ravenna and Florence to move Dante's remains to his hometown of Florence in 2021 for the 700th anniversary of his death.

Known as "the father of the Italian language, Dante was exiled from Florence in 1302 for political reasons. He eventually settled in Ravenna, where he died in 1321.

Dante is buried in the Basilica di San Francesco, where 400,000 visitors pay him homage every year. This is why some critics have spoken of "a tourist marketing move with a questionable national and international echo."

Ravenna Mayor Michele De Pascale did not comment on the possible move but spoke of being open to collaborating with Florence and Verona for a major national event to celebrate the anniversary.

Florence eventually came to regret Dante's exile and made repeated requests for the return of the poet's remains.

When Pope Leo X ordered the remains sent back to Florence in 1519, the monks who guarded Dante's tomb refused, going so far


as to conceal the bones in a false wall of the monastery.

During exile, Dante composed his greatest work, *The Divine Comedy*. He never overcame the pain caused by his exile.

In *Paradiso*'s Canto 25, he expresses the hope that he would one day return home to Florence:

"If it should happen ... If this sacred poem — this work so shared by heaven and by earth that it has made me lean through these long years — can ever overcome the cruelty that bars me from the fair fold where I slept, a lamb opposed to wolves that war on it, by then with other voice, with other fleece, I shall return as poet and put on, at my baptismal font, the laurel crown ..."

Should we listen to his wish?
