# Flag waving stands as a time-honored Italian tradition

Editor's note: This article first appeared in the Inferno in April 2023.

ince the Middle Ages, flag waving—or flag throwing—has been a revered tradition across Italy.

Historically, flags were commonly used by the military in battle to identify troops and communicate orders. The flags held the symbols of nobility, origin, groups or neighborhoods.

The Sbandieratori—or flag wavers—were brave, heroic and held in high esteem. The treasured flags were never allowed to touch the ground. In combat, capturing an opponent's flag was considered a coup, removing the opponent's ability to communicate effectively on the battlefield.

In times of peace, the practice of flag waving evolved into ceremonial use, identifying families, cities, schools or regions, each with a coat of arms,

### Advisory and finance

The most significant event to affect the Dante Club board this month is the announcement that our treasurer, Tom Mezzanares, has decided to step down to better enjoy life. He is a past president, a longtime treasurer, an active member who brought dozens of friends to events and a skilled bocce player (perhaps he'll travel more and play less so other teams have a chance at the championship).

The advisory and finance committee now has the arduous task of replacing him. Tom has provided a list of the many things he does, and we will immediately look for multiple members to take over these tasks—yes, it will take many people to fill the voids.

The first task will be to identify a new treasurer and probably an assistant treasurer as well to oversee the finances of the club and the event center. We will then assign other tasks to appropriate board members or any other members who step up to help.

We continue to define some management processes to better handle our finances. These changes will evolve over the next few months, but we are pushing to make them happen as soon as possible.

Six initiatives are being developed with the goal of generating funds to alleviate cash-flow issues. More information should be available within the month.

### General manager's report

July brought back the Dante Club's summertime members and guests barbecue, with 170 attendees enjoying 10-ounce ribeye steaks with all the trimmings.

During the month, we also saw the return of some of our monthly groups at the Dante Event Center, including Sons in Retirement branches 23 and 69, as well as the return of the Piemonte Reale Italian Club Ladies Grill Night.

We continue to book events for the remainder of the summer and as far out as 2026. We look forward to cooler months ahead.

Starting this month, because of the growing costs of labor and food as well as inflation, the Sunday Family Dinner price will increase to \$22 for adults and \$12 for children. Members dinners will increase to \$25.

As mentioned at the June members meeting, we are organizing a bus trip to the Italian Festival in Reno at the ElDorado Resort Casino on Oct. 12. A limited number of seats are available. The annual Frank Calcagno and Vic Martinelli Golf Tournament will be played at Alister Mackenzie golf course, Haggin Oaks, on Sept. 14. This is the Dante Club's major fundraiser of the year.

### Save pull tabs

Since Ron Cristoni challenged Dante Club and Women's Auxiliary members to collect pull tabs to benefit the Ronald McDonald House, the response has been overwhelming.

Cristoni offered this update: "I dropped off 67 pounds of pull tabs at the Ronald McDonald House and asked the desk clerk what the going price was for parents to spend the night. The price is still \$20 a night. So if the Ronald McDonald House cashed in the pull tabs at the going rate of \$1.25, that is \$83.75 or four nights' stay for parents who can't afford the \$20 per night. Please thank the auxiliary. They turned in two giant bags of pull tabs." The club and the auxiliary have a lot to be proud of. To date, we have collected over 1,625 pounds of pull tabs and raised nearly \$2,000 for the program.

The program helps offset the cost of overnight accommodations for parents with a child hospitalized at UC Davis Medical Center.

Club and auxiliary members are asked to continue bringing pull tabs from pet food, soda and beer cans to their meetings.

crest or symbol.

Although the practice of flag waving is not unique to Italy, it could be said that Italy has raised the practice to an art form.

Ensembles of Sbandieratori in colorful medieval or Renaissance attire still proudly entertain at sporting events, celebrations, tournaments and festivals, including Carnevale and the Palio d'Asti.

Throwers are highly trained and skilled but also athletic, graceful and elegant. Their routines are exacting and synchronized.

The classic style is performed standing, with performers using one or two flags or banners. The

acrobatic style uses multiple flags and gymnastic movements. Drums and trumpets herald every arrival and command the performance of the Sbandieratori. It is a regal display.

Troupes of Sbandieratori continue to perform and preserve their proud tradition and heritage across Italy and worldwide.

Last year I had the opportunity to view this timehonored tradition in a performance by the acclaimed Sbandieratori del Palio D'Asti.

I was completely mesmerized but managed to snap a few photos of the colorful display.

# Lavender adds a flavorful twist to Italian dessert

Panna cotta is a creamy, custard-like dessert from the Piemonte region of Italy. Its name means "cooked cream" in Italian. Easy to prepare, it belongs in the category of Italian desserts called dolci al cucchiaio, which refers to desserts eaten with a spoon, or cucchiaio, such as puddings, custards, flans and mousses.

Panna cotta is a versatile dessert that can be enjoyed yearround and customized to taste. Flavor it with rum, marsala, cocoa, citrus zests or extracts such as vanilla and almond. Then garnish the finished panna cotta with syrups, fresh or poached fruit and fruit sauces or purées. This version is flavored with

lavender, but feel free to omit the

lavender if the taste doesn't appeal.

PANNA COTTA ALLA LAVANDA

### (Lavender panna cotta) Ingredients:

- 3 tablespoons cold water
- 1 envelope powdered unflavored gelatin (2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoons or 7 grams)
- 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cups heavy cream (do not substitute milk for cream)
- $1\frac{1}{4}$  cups whole milk
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon dried lavender buds or
  <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup fresh organic lavender buds

• 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

### **Directions:**

*Prepare six custard cups or* ramekins. The desserts can be eaten directly from the cups, but if you plan to unmold them, lightly oil the cups first or pour water into them and then pour the water out to give each cup a light water coating. Put cold water in a small bowl and sprinkle powdered gelatin on top. Let it soften for 5 to 10 minutes. Combine heavy cream, milk, sugar and lavender in a medium saucepan. Heat gently, stirring to *dissolve sugar, until the mixture* just comes to a boil. Remove from heat and add softened gelatin. See JUST LIKE MOM, Page 8

Return pot to the stove and heat gently, stirring until gelatin is completely dissolved, about two or three minutes. Stir in vanilla extract.

Pour mixture through a metal strainer or sieve into a large measuring cup or bowl with a spout.

A spout makes it easier to pour the mixture into the cups without spilling. Straining the mixture is required in case small lumps of undissolved gelatin or lavender particles remain.

Pour ½ cup of the mixture into the cups for six servings. Cool to room temperature, then cover the cups with plastic wrap and put them in the refrigerator for several hours to set and chill.

### RECORDING OUR HERITAGE Professors' book perfectly captures the Italian American experience

Any of you have asked about my source for the "famous Italians" articles I occasionally provide to the Dante's Inferno newsletter.

The source for many of them is a wonderful book on the five centuries of the Italian American experience: *La Storia* by Jerre Mangione and Ben Morreale.

The authors are professors of English, literature and history— Mangione at the University of Pennsylvania and Morreale at the State University of New York at Plattsburgh.

The essence of the book may be summarized by this excerpt:

"It is the contributions of the great majority that are most difficult to record—those millions of anonymous immigrants who took part in building railroads, tunnels and skyscrapers, who worked in factories and farms, helping to clothe and feed the country, and who are old men and women today ... We record their saga, as well as that of their American children ... not only to show what it meant to be alive during the period of See BOOK, Page 9


