Attendance lower than typical for October events

ctober was an active month for the Dante Club, although attendance at events was generally disappointing.

The Sunday night family dinner was about 40 people short of recent sell-outs. Only 59 people turned out for the Italian Heritage Night dinner, when we had over 160 the prior year. And only about 30 people came for the bocce sausage get-together.

On the bright side, the Dante Women's Auxiliary had over 210 members and guests for its dinner and annual mercato in October.

November brings the start of the holiday season, with our regular meetings and the Sunday family dinners all featuring traditional menus with turkey and trimmings.

LOOKING BACK

Histories of Dante Club and St. Mary's unfold side by side

he history of the Dante Club in Sacramento is long and its locations align closely with the locations of St. Mary's Church.

In the early 1900s, the church was located first at 818 N St. and then at Seventh and T streets. At the same time, the Dante Club was in a building at 1511 P St., where it remained for 34 years.

The church and the club were easily accessible to the many Italians who had settled in Sacramento. The newcomers wanted to be close to their church and to other Italians who already lived here. They also wanted access to the many services

that both the church and the club offered to the community.

As its congregation grew after World War II, St. Mary's Church relocated to east Sacramento at 1333 58th St. Groundbreaking for the new church building occurred on Sept. 29, 1946, and Bishop Armstrong blessed the cornerstone on Sept. 21, 1947.

The first Mass was offered on Aug. 1, 1948. The first wedding was a double wedding celebrated by sisters Alma and Gilda Lagomarsino with Sebastiano Stassi and Nick

Legacy fund donations

The Dante Club Legacy Fund was created during the pandemic as a way for members to help the club through a difficult period.

The Dante board of directors has decided to reinvigorate the fund as one of five strategies to pay off the club's remodeling mortgage. Donations to the fund will help retire the mortgage early.

The Legacy Fund has three donation levels: platinum, \$1000 or more; gold, \$500; and silver, \$250. Donors will be recognized annually in the newsletter and at a members dinner. They'll also be honored on a plaque in the Dante Event Center.

Donations will be applied to the mortgage principal each month.

Donors should mail or deliver a check to the Dante Club (attn: treasurer) and give instructions on how the donor or a person honored by the donor should be recognized —what name should be included on the plaque and in the newsletter. Donors may remain anonymous if they prefer.

The Ronald McDonald House near UC Davis Medical Center charges \$20 per night for parents to stay there while their children receive treatment at the hospital.

The pull-tab program helps those who can't afford the cost of accommodations by accepting donations of aluminum-can pull tabs, which it then sells for cash.

The Dante Club has donated to the program since March 2018. The Women's Auxiliary also participates.

On Sept. 17, Ron Cristoni dropped off 31.7 pounds of Dante Club pull tabs at the Ronald McDonald House

Our club and auxiliary have donated a total of 1,757.7 pounds of pull tabs.

Tamantini on Aug. 8, 1948.

The Italian families followed the church, and an Italian community formed on the streets of east Sacramento. The area bounded by 48th Street to 59th Street and J Street to Folsom Boulevard is now designated "Little Italy" by the city of Sacramento.

In 1958, 10 years after the church relocation, the general membership of the Dante Club decided that a new club building was needed. A committee was formed under the chairmanship of past president Nick Martinelli Sr., which led to the purchase of land on Fair Oaks Boulevard, closer to the new St. Mary's Church on 58th Street.

The completion of a new building for the Dante Club was celebrated in 1960. The building was an immediate success, and the club was able to pay off the mortgage in 1970.

As Sacramento has grown, so has the population of Italians who live here. Our Italian ancestors established

strong, close-knit communities, such as those of east Sacramento. They developed a strong cultural fabric made up of shared faith, social clubs and businesses. They maintained their language and culture, all while adopting American language and culture. All of this has allowed Italians in Sacramento to succeed as a community and to maintain their cultural heritage.

Throughout the years, the Dante Club has been a key force in ensuring the Italian cultural presence in Sacramento. Times have changed, but the club remains an important place where Italian Americans can gather to celebrate their heritage, meet old family friends and mark important events in their lives.



Want to book a personal event? Don't delay

The Dante Event Center is booking into the 2027 event season.

Any club members interested in hosting a personal event at the center should inquire as early as possible.

To host an event, a member must first schedule a meeting with general manager Jennifer Peretti or event coordinator Ashley Perham.

Available dates and rooms, type of event, estimated guest count, timing, catering needs and other pertinent details will be discussed.

The member's desired room and date will be placed on hold for two weeks to allow time to decide if the center is the place for the event, without the date getting booked in the meantime.

At the end of the two weeks, if a security deposit has not been received, the date will be released.

To confirm an event, a deposit must be paid and a contract must be signed and dated.

Members can rent a banquet room at a 50% discount for a personal event for themselves, for family members— limited to spouses, parents and children—or for a personally owned business.


