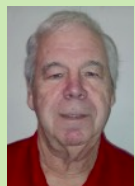

Bylaws revision proposed

Revising dues and initiation fee information in the Article III Membership section of the Dante Club bylaws has been proposed.

This is the current wording relating to dues for classes 1 and 2 (regular and associate) members:

1. The dues for classes No. 1 and 2 will be \$100 per year.

Here are three proposals for revising this section:

- 1. The dues for classes No. 1 and 2 will be \$1,000 per year.**
- 2. The dues for classes No. 1 and 2 will be \$500 per year.**
- 3. The dues for classes No. 1 and 2 will be \$250 per year.**

The second reading and voting on these proposed bylaws changes will take place Jan. 19 during the membership meeting.

Legacy fund donations

The Dante Club Legacy Fund was created during the pandemic as a way for members to help the club through a difficult period.

The Dante board of directors has decided to reinvigorate the fund as one of five strategies to pay off the club's remodeling mortgage. Donations to the fund will help retire the mortgage early.

The Legacy Fund has three donation levels: platinum, \$1,000 or more; gold, \$500; and silver, \$250. Donors will be recognized annually in the newsletter and at a members dinner.

They'll also be honored on a plaque in the Dante Event Center.

Donations will be applied to the mortgage principal each month.

Donors should mail or deliver a check to the Dante Club (attn: treasurer) and explain how the donor or a person honored by the donor should be recognized—what name should be on the plaque and in the newsletter. Donors may remain anonymous if they prefer.

Annual dinner payments

Members can pay monthly or annually for meeting-night dinners. When paying in advance, members cannot receive a refund or a credit for any dinner they don't attend, but they don't need to tell the event center if they can't attend, as they have already paid.

The annual payment option is a convenience for those who don't want to pay monthly.

For reservation substitutions, members must call 916-925-8230 by noon the day of the event and give the substitute's name. Any substitution not confirmed by noon on event day can't be honored.

Pull-tab program

The Ronald McDonald House charges \$20 per night for parents to stay there while their children receive treatment at UC Davis Medical Center. The pull-tab program helps those who can't afford the cost by accepting donations of aluminum-can pull tabs, which it then sells for cash.

The Dante Club has donated to the program since March 2018. The Women's Club also participates. Our clubs have donated a total of 1,757.7 pounds of pull tabs to the Ronald McDonald House.

Scholarships

Graduating high school seniors seeking a Dante Club scholarship next year must submit applications by March 31. Applications are available online and at the Dante Event Center office.

Students must provide their grade-point average, two letters of recommendation, a personal essay and activities they've participated in during their high school years.

communal culinary practices and cherished family rituals centered around cooking.

But now Italians can claim added cachet: The United Nations' cultural agency, the U.N. Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, or UNESCO, has officially recognized the international impact and importance of Italian cuisine in all its vast variety.

On Dec. 10, during the 20th annual session of UNESCO's Intergovernmental Committee for the Safeguarding of Intangible Cultural Heritage held in New Delhi, India, UNESCO honored Italian cuisine with the agency's Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity designation, marking the first time a nation's entire cuisine has earned the distinction.

"It is with great emotion and pride that Italy welcomes the decision of UNESCO," Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni said in a public video post on Facebook after the honor was announced. "It is a historic recognition ... because for us Italians, cuisine is not just food or a collection of recipes. It is culture, tradition, work and well-being. Cooking means taking care of family, friends and guests. It means combining our history and our future, passing down ancient knowledge and constantly turning it into something new, protecting



the environment and defending biodiversity."

In her video post, Meloni made a point of singling out Italians who live abroad.

"It is also thanks to them that Italian cuisine and everything it represents is so highly appreciated around the world," she said. "Today we celebrate an achievement that belongs to Italy but that enriches humanity as a whole. Thank you all, and long live Italian cuisine."

As Italians living abroad, we at the Dante Club shout "Hear, hear!" to Meloni's sentiment.

We are proud of the part we have played over the years in celebrating our ancestral country of origin, including the flavorful foods we hold dear. Many of us have happy memories of family tables laden with delectable dishes made by our nonnas.

In the Dante Club kitchen our chefs have always strived to serve

us meals featuring favorite Italian dishes. In November we celebrated the late local chef legend Biba Caggiano, whose restaurant for many years helped Sacramentans broaden their tastes for authentically crafted Italian cuisine.

So, yes, we love all things Italian—especially our food. And now, thanks to the UNESCO designation, all the world OFFICIALLY loves it, too. Long live Italian cuisine!



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Want to book a personal event? Don't delay

The Dante Event Center is booking special events for the 2026-2027 event seasons. Any men's and women's club members interested in hosting a personal event at the center should inquire about booking as early as possible.

To host an event, a member must first schedule a meeting with general manager Jennifer Peretti or event coordinator Ashley Perham.

Available dates and rooms, type of event, estimated guest count, timing, catering needs and other pertinent details will be discussed.

A member's desired room and date will be placed on hold for two weeks to allow the member time to decide if the center is the best place for the

event, without the date getting booked in the meantime.

At the end of the two weeks, if confirmation and a security deposit have not been received, the date will be released to the public.

To confirm an event, a deposit must be paid and a contract must be signed and dated.

Members can rent a banquet room at a 50% discount for a personal event for themselves, for family members—limited to spouses, parents and children—or for a personally owned business.
